Contributing to a digital humanities project means that your work may appear online. **Please review** the following privacy options, <u>circle one</u>, and <u>provide your signature</u> at the bottom of the page. Your instructor is available to respond to any questions or concerns you may have about online privacy.

- Option 1: Contribute using your name. You will contribute using your name. Your work may appear in web searches for your name during the lifespan of the website.
- Option 2: Contribute using an alias. You will contribute under a unique alias that is shared only with the instructor and website administrator. Your contribution will be visible online, but your identity remains private and your contribution will not appear in web searches for your name.
- Option 3: Contribute offline. After individual consultation with the instructor, if you have legitimate concerns about contributing to a public course site, the instructor may grant permission to submit posts offline.
